# **School Uniform**

We appreciate your support in setting a high standard in terms of uniform and it has been wonderful to see all of the children start the term looking so smart and ready to work. Our uniform reflects how proud the children are to be part of the Charles Baines community and shows that they are ready to work hard at all times. Please be aware that trainers are not part of our school uniform. It is acceptable for children to bring trainers to change into when playing sports at break and lunch times but smart black shoes should be worn by all children in the classroom. Please ensure all uniform is labelled clearly with your child's name so that it can be easily returned, should it be misplaced.

#### **Curriculum Update**

The website has been updated with the new curriculum maps for 2016/17. These offer an overview of the topics your child will explore as the academic year progresses and will allow you to plan any home activities or days out to support their learning. If you would like any more information about any topics to be covered this year, please speak to your child's teacher. Maths Whizz is still available and should be used as much as possible at home. The app is available on laptops and tablets and is proven to significantly improve maths progress if accessed regularly. We recommend that pupils visit the app for a few minutes at a time, focusing on the broad range of maths skills they can develop.

Years 1 to Year 6 have access to the app – usernames and passwords are available from the class teacher. If you need any support accessing the app on a device, please pop into school and we'll do all we can to help.

### **Absence Policy**

The threshold for persistent absence is now 90% and has been set by the Government. There are also regulations about persistent lateness, as well as term time holidays. School has employed an Education Welfare Officer who will be monitoring attendance very closely and contacting families of children whose attendance is of concern to support in any way she can.

#### **Attendance**

This year we will aspire to achieve 97% whole school attendance. Please help us to achieve this by minimising appointments and holidays etc. in school time. We had 10 children who achieved 100% attendance last year – and it was no coincidence that they made outstanding progress!

#### **Values**

Values play a very important role at Charles Baines. We strongly believe in educating the whole child and feel our school values help to develop interpersonal skills and a growth mindset, encouraging the children to be confident, determined and aspirational learners. Our school's twelve values this year are:
