### E-safety and viewing inappropriate material

Lots of children have received tablets, games consoles, mobile phones and other forms of technology as Christmas presents. We have been given the opportunity to work with children, staff and parents to deliver E-safety workshops to enable staff and parents to keep children safe when using such items. These workshops will highlight the importance of parental monitoring of these items and will reinforce the importance for not giving them access to the internet unless they are absolutely ready in terms of maturity and self-regulation. We will run a number of workshops for the children to develop their knowledge and awareness of online safety on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> January. I will also be inviting any parents who are interested in finding out about keeping their children safe and developing their knowledge of E-safety on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> January too. Further details will follow.

#### **School Closure Procedures**

In the event of bad weather, a text message will be sent out as soon as a decision has been made as to whether the School can operate safely. We have to assess the following when making a decision:

- Accessibility on foot and the risk of falling on the premises
- Accessibility by car/ambulance for pick up/emergency services
- Staff ratios to ensure supervision is at or above those agreed within each class and safety can be maintained

We will also inform the Snowline at Lincs FM and put a notice on the website. I appreciate this can cause inconvenience, but the health and safety of the children is paramount.
